

Gateway is funded through Tertiary Education to help students transition seamlessly into the workplace. Students can start working in the "real world" while they are at school and start some work-related training that can contribute towards NCEA. This opportunity is offered to Year 11 up to Year 13 students.

We asked three students to share their experience of Gateway.

Johannes van der Walt.

Johannes is a year 13 student who joined Rodney College in 2021. Johannes's dream is to become a commercial pilot, and he did a course through Aero Club. He realizes that he might need to work for a while before he can start his formal training as a commercial pilot. He therefore also



considered an apprenticeship in the building industry. He has used this opportunity to obtain his certificates in Health and Safety, Height Safety, Personal Financial Skills and First Aid. Johannes joined Gateway for the opportunity to get quality free training

interventions paid by the Ministry while earning credits and gaining useable knowledge in the workplace.

Ethan Sheffield is 16 years old and in year 12. He joined Gateway in 2022. Ethan plans to qualify as a panel beater and have his own business in the future. He uses the opportunity to

gain work experience through Mito at Gibbons Panel and Paint in Wellsford. He successfully completed the certificates in Health and Safety, Height Safety, First Aid and Personal Financial Skills. All these courses prepare him to seamlessly transition into the workplace.



Caitlin Cramound is 16 years old and in Year 12. She joined Gateway at 15 and had the opportunity to study Dairy farming modules which prepared her to work on a diary farm. She did not have a lot of knowledge but was able to put the training into practice. She dreams of being a manager on a Dairy farm and later manage her own herd. She appreciates the opportunity to get

on the job training. The Health and Safety, First Aid and quad bike courses helped her a lot. She specifically mentioned the quad bike course as it teaches her to safely operate it, especially on steep slopes.

On Wednesday 16 August, 22 Year 10 students participated in our annual tree planting day at Atiu In partnership with the organisation, Conservation Creek Regional Park. Students took part in this social action to reinforce the learning they have done as part of the Social Studies program.

In Social Studies we have been exploring the concept of Kaitiakitanga and environmental sustainability. Students have looked at a case study of deforestation in the Amazon rainforest and appreciate the importance of protecting and adding to Aotearoa's native forest as a way to

provide habitat for native birds and filtration for our waterways.

Volunteers New Zealand, our students planted 632 native trees. The hope is that in years to come students will be able to return to Atiu Creek and feel proud of the contribution they have made to protecting our local environment.

SPORTS ROUNDUP AUGUST 2023

Term 3 has been a very busy term. Netball on Friday nights at Rodney Netball Centre and Saturdays at North Harbour has come to an end. North Harbour Netball was a big effort for all involved travelling to Auckland every Saturday, but it really paid off, as Rodney 2 won their grade in a very exciting final. Rodney 1 placed 3rd in Open B Grade, placing them 19th out of 144 Teams.

Fifty-three students and staff travelled to Dargaville High School to compete in the annual Ouad Tournament. This is a tournament with four schools competing; Dargaville High School, Ruawai College, Otamatea High School and Rodney College. The students compete in Basketball, 7-a-side Football, Volleyball, Turbo Touch and Chess. This year they added a new event which involved 2 boys and 2 girls from each school.
