Reviews and Feedback

Our policies follow a 3-year review schedule that ensures our content stays up to date. Each term the school community is able to provide feedback on the content and Implementation of policies under review.

teambuilding/ leadership games, skits, push ups, walks, waterhole swimming and challenge courses.


We also had the opportunity to go on early morning runs which were challenging but enjoyable and helped us be ready for the action packed days.

STUDENTS & CARS

Permission to bring motor vehicles to school, in special circumstances, can be obtained from Mrs Hackett by completing a car pass form explaining the reason for use, car make, model and registration number, together with evidence of the student's driver's licence. The student's original driver's licence is to be sighted by Mrs Hackett, who will photocopy and place on file with approval.

Vehicles brought to school must not carry any other unauthorised passengers and must park in the student car park on the top courts on the left-

hand side facing the bus bays. We expect prior permission for any use of a motorised vehicle. This includes motorbikes.



Rules Governing Use of Student Cars

- 1. The only students who may bring cars to school are those with full or restricted licenses.
- Applications for permission to bring a car to school must be signed by a parent or caregiver.
- 3. Cars are not to be used or entered during the school day. No students are to go up town in their cars at lunchtime.
- 4. No passengers may be carried to or from school unless the student has their full licence.
- 5. Breaches of any of these rules will lead to cancellation of the right to bring a car to school.
