## RODNEY COLLEGE UNIFORM CODE - 2024

The Rodney College Board of Trustees mandates the uniform regulations and reviews them regularly. Students are expected to wear the school uniform with pride at all times. This includes to and from school. Uniform items are Rodney College regulation and are only available through the school Uniform Shop (except hats, footwear and PE shorts).

## JEWELLERY: Students may wear

- Plain stud or sleeper earrings. No other facial piercings.
- One watch
- One necklace, not visible


## TAONGA

- One item of Taonga may be worn around the neck


## GENERAL

- Hair colour and nail polish to be natural tones
- Boys must be clean shaven or well groomed
- If you choose to wear make up to school, it must be natural looking and not clearly visible
- Length of skirt is not to be more than 15 cm above the knee
- Plain black or navy caps or bucket hats (no logos), are acceptable for Terms 1 and 4 only but not to be worn inside
- Plain black or navy beanie (no logos), are acceptable for Terms 2 and 3 only but not to be worn inside

FORMAL UNIFORM - blazer, white shirt, tie, skirt or long black trousers, shoes and socks / pantyhose

- Formal uniform is compulsory for school leaders and for out of school formal occasions. Shirts tucked in for formal occasions. Blazers and ties will be able to be leased through the uniform shop.


## SPORTS JACKET

- Sports jackets and sports hoodies are ONLY to be worn when out on sports trips.

NB: These are NOT to be worn as regular school uniform.

## Taonga

## Definition of Taonga:

- A tangible item of adornment that reflects tikanga Maori (Māori customs)
- A representation of Maori culture and identity
- Taonga can be made with traditional bone, greenstone or wood
- A religious representation


## Taonga may be worn in the following manner:

- One item only will be worn
- Around the neck ONLY, excluding earrings or head dress of any kind
- Outside the school uniform allowing 'taonga' to be visible
- Taonga must not be worn when students are engaged in physical activity where the 'taonga' may cause harm to themselves (the wearer) and/or others, eg in sports, drama or technology


## School management responsibilities:

The school reserves the right to require students, not in correct uniform, to wear loan items of uniform while at school.
The Principal/Deputy Principal reserves the right to define appropriate dress.
